Onepile Foundation has been committed to promoting youth participation in international dialogues on digital inclusion, sustainability, and education. Through our Youth Ambassador Programme, we empower young leaders aged 14-19 to engage in meaningful discussions at the global level.

In 2024, we built on our previous work by deepening our commitment to youth literacy and sustainability. The focus of our Lightning Talk was:


- 1 Using literature and digital tools to promote the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).
